



GAUDENZIA'S SERVICES IN DAUPHIN, CUMBERLAND AND PERRY COUNTIES

- In the greater Harrisburg area, Gaudenzia operates 24 programs, providing a variety of services including detoxification, residential and outpatient programs. In addition, specialized populations served include adolescent males, women and children, and also individuals coping with mental illness concurrent to substance abuse.
- Annually, Gaudenzia residential programs in the greater Harrisburg area treat 2,000 individuals.
- Gibson House provides supportive housing in Dauphin County for homeless adults with special needs. The facility houses 16 single, low-income men and women, through a Community Residential Rehabilitation program. Residents are mental health referred consumers who have been recently discharged from prison, often recovering from substance abuse addictions. The 13,500 square foot building was the first program Gaudenzia built from the ground up in the greater Harrisburg area.
- Chambers Hill Adolescent Program (CHAP) provides drug and alcohol treatment to male adolescents in a residential setting.
- DELTA Community offers transitional housing for homeless, single-parent families. Less than 2% of DELTA's completions have returned to homelessness. While at DELTA, residents are encouraged to obtain higher education degrees and pursue professional careers and permanent housing.

ABOUT GAUDENZIA:

In 1968 in Philadelphia, a group of business, political, and community leaders as well as people in recovery from drug and alcohol use recognized a serious problem: a growing number of people affected by addiction were unable to find help. Gaudenzia was founded to help meet this need. Since then, it is estimated that Gaudenzia has admitted into treatment over 200,000 individuals.

Gaudenzia began as a single facility. Today we operate 161 programs at 90 facilities throughout Pennsylvania, Maryland and Delaware. Now serving about 17,000 individuals annually, Gaudenzia operates residential and outpatient treatment programs, including specialty programs for pregnant and parenting women, individuals with HIV/AIDS, people coping with mental illness in addition to substance abuse issues, adolescents and more.

Gaudenzia continues to improve and expand our services, helping individuals and their loved ones overcome the ravages of addiction to drugs and alcohol.
